

## Bosnian War Crimes Suspect Karadzic Caught

BELGRADE, Serbia - Bosnian Serb wartime president Radovan Karadzic, indicted for genocide in the Bosnia war, was captured in disguise near Belgrade after 11 years on the run and had been working as a doctor, Serbian officials said Tuesday.

The arrest Monday of Karadzic, who is held responsible for the siege of Sarajevo and the massacre

of 8,000 Muslims in the Bosnian town of Srebrenica in 1995, was a condition for Serbian progress toward membership in the European Union.

He is the most prominent Balkan war crimes suspect arrested since late Serbian President Slobodan Milosevic was sent to the UN war crimes tribunal in The Hague on genocide charges in 2001, leaving only two suspects at large.

The Serbian officials said Karadzic was caught while moving from one Belgrade suburb to another. They showed reporters a photograph of an unrecognizable

## Emergency UN Help Needed on Temple: Minister

Foreign Affairs Minister Hor Namhong announced Tuesday that the "imminent state of war" with Thailand required the emergency intervention of the UN Security Council, and that he would fly to New York this week to personally request assistance.

This is Cambodia's second try at lobbying an international mediator to help resolve the ongoing military

standoff at Preah Vihear temple, after a plea for Asean intervention was blocked by Thailand, Hor Namhong said Tuesday morning at a press conference attended by representatives from every embassy to Cambodia, except Thailand.

"Despite our maximum restraint, despite our compromises, we have not received any positive response from the other side," Hor Namhong said.

Cambodia's permanent mission to the UN filed a formal complaint

to the UN Security Council late Monday night, hours after peace talks with Thailand ended in a stalemate, Hor Namhong said.

"In the face of this imminent state of war, in the face of this vicious threat to our heritage land, we have an obligation to resort to the UN Security [Council] in order to... not resort to war," he added.

Cambodia is also seeking Unesco's intervention.

In a letter to Unesco Director

## Leader Touts Funcinpec's 'Patient' Path to Reform

The Cambodia Daily continues with its third in a series of interviews with senior leaders of the top five contenders in the national election, with Funcinpec President Keo Path Rasmey.

Formerly the secretary of retired King Norodom Sihanouk, Keo Path Rasmey has served as Cambodia's ambassador to a number of nations, most recently Germany.

Elected president of Funcinpec during the same special congress that

ousted Prince Norodom Ranariddh, Keo Path Rasmey—who is now a deputy prime minister—has led the junior partner in government since late 2006. He sat down recently with The Cambodia Daily's John Maloy and Yun Samean at his home in Phnom Penh.

**Q:** A major issue in Cambodia at the moment is the price of goods, particularly gasoline and food. What specific steps would Funcinpec take to keep prices in check?

**A:** First of all, Funcinpec must have a real program to control economic policy.

We have to have the means to increase the salary of poor people, of workers. So, how do you increase [those salaries]? That is also part of the economic policy, the boosting of government revenue. It is one of the solutions and a major long-term policy, because how can we otherwise increase the salaries of workers, the people who
